### **Requirements:**

- Participants in this year's Summer Reading Program must read for 15 minutes three times a week for 6 consecutive weeks
- Only minutes from books checked out through our library will count.
- Each child must request one Inter-Library Loan (ILL) item as part of our Summer Reading Program this year.
- Anyone unfamiliar with borrowing on ILL, please stop by the library and our staff or volunteers will assist you. We will also have an ILL demonstration prior to our program on Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup> at 5:45pm.
- A Reading Contract must be signed by a Parent or Guardian
- A Photo/Video Release form must be signed by a Parent or Guardian.

## Monday July 20<sup>th</sup> 6:30 pm: "Constellations" Connect the Dots in the Sky!

Mrs. Jody Suprenant, our local High School Science teacher, will have you interested and intrigued as she takes you into space & demonstrates how a constellation is a group of visible stars that form a pattern when viewed from Earth. The pattern they form may take the shape of an animal, a mythological creature, a man, a woman, or an inanimate object such as a microscope, a compass, or a crown. Children can also earn gold stickers by
